Feeding America Donates NEW Equipment

MILWAUKEE (CBS 58) – Food insecurity remains an issue in Southeastern Wisconsin.

But one gift to a local pantry is helping feed families while offering people a new job skill.

Ebenezer Stone Ministries operates a central location on Milwaukee's southwest side.

They connect at least six other pantries with needed items for thousands of people in their communities.

"Those pantries supply food for Kenosha, or the south side of Milwaukee. I think there's one that comes from Beloit. Places that we can't reach, that's not accessible they can come here and load up and feed the people," Michael Haas, Executive Director, Ebenezer Stone Ministries said.

It's all part of their partnership with Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin.

And today, the non-profit donated three pieces of equipment for the pantry – a forklift and two pallet jacks.



It just goes so far in their mission to not only serve the community over here but also their employees, and people who come right to them,” Tony Cartagena, of Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin, said.

Both organizations say food insecurity has grown tremendously during the COVID-19 pandemic.

And so, Haas says the food pantries are more vital now, then ever.

“A lot of people lost their jobs or a lot of people couldn’t work because they got sick,” Haas said.

The equipment donation will go beyond just moving pallets here.

Ebenezer Stone Ministries is partnering with MATC to offer fork-lift certification for students.



“And so the idea is to use some of these items to train people in this warehouse so that they can go out into the job market and move right into a career,” Haas said.

Ebenezer’s hub opened in August and also stores furniture, clothing and hygiene products for organizations to take.

Just over a year ago, we had a dream to increase our footprint by securing a warehouse wherein we would be able to store greater amounts of food, including fresh produce for the south side, where fresh food is in dismally short supply. That dream of additional space was realized in the fall of 2021 and is now known as Ebenezer East, located on 12th and Bruce. Through a divinely inspired partnership between the Siebert Foundation and Feeding America, Ebenezer East has become a hub through which at least six other local pantries receive and help disperse food. What has transpired is well beyond what we could have imagined.

We would like to specifically and humbly thank our partners without whom this expansion on 12th and Bruce would be impossible. With a grant from the **Greater Milwaukee Foundation**, we will be able to purchase an industrial cooler to store meat, dairy and other perishable items. Our partnership with **Feeding America** supplies us with an enormous amount of food. They also purchased shelving for food storage in our new space. Additionally, they blessed us with a donation of two pallet jacks and a forklift. We are working with **MATC** to become a training site for students who wish to learn how to operate a forklift, furthering their opportunities to find a good paying job. This gift keeps on giving! The **Siebert Foundation's** generosity has specifically increased our ability to provide more food and hot meals to our patrons at our pantry site, as well as to provide wrap-around services as other needs surface. Their gift also helped us to secure our warehouse. We would like to thank the **Cousins Foundation** and the **Stricker American Family Foundation**, whose funds allowed us to purchase proper equipment to process, clean, store and distribute fresh fruit and vegetables and other food items. We greatly appreciate the ongoing donations we receive from Aggies Bakery, Aldi, Amazon, Polermo's Pizza, Johnsonville, and Walmart. Additionally, our partnership with **MPD** has added value and strength to our community outreaches, **Nonprofit Management Fund** provided a capacity building grants, as do the nurses that volunteer their time to do health screenings on Saturday mornings. We are rich in relationship and blessed beyond measure to serve alongside all our generous partners.
